

FEED YOUR BODY, FEED YOUR SOUL LENTEN PROGRAM- Has Started PERSONAL PRAYER SERIES

SIX VIDEOS BY FR. BONIFACE HICKS, O.S.B.

Prayer is at the heart of the Christian life. Given that we are weak and even sinful human beings, how can it be that God has anything to do with us? What does it mean to have a personal relationship with God? Why is God so silent and hidden? How do we grow in prayer? Personal Prayer: A Guide for Receiving the Father's Love brings the depth of human experience together with the Catholic tradition of prayer to present the path to an intimate and vulnerable relationship with God. Fr. Boniface Hicks, O.S.B., a Benedictine monk of Saint Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, PA. Since his ordination to the priesthood in 2004, he has provided spiritual direction for many men and women, including married couples, seminarians, consecrated religious, and priests-even as he completed his Doctorate in computer science at Penn State University. He is the programming manger and an on-air contributor for We Are One Body Catholic radio, and he has recorded thousands of radio programs on theology and the spiritual life. He has extensive experience as a retreat master for laity, consecrated religious, and priests. Mass at 4pm followed by a light meal of soup, bread, and cookies.

The next sessions will be **on March 12**<sup>th</sup> **March 19**<sup>th</sup> **March 26**<sup>th</sup> **April 2**<sup>nd</sup> **April 9**<sup>th</sup> **DVD presentation** is 22 minutes followed by a period of discussion.

#### First Sunday of Lent Cycle C

At the heart of the Old Testament there is great story of liberation; how God intervened to free his people from slavery. The story of exodus is freedom from oppression and the beginning of their journey to the Promised Land. And in today's first reading we heard how people always kept that good memory alive.

Their new freedom meant new pain and they had to face a new problem – the wilderness. They thought the security in the bondage is better than the insecurity in freedom. For the price of freedom was wilderness. During their 40 years in the desert the people were tested. They were hungry and thirsty. They complained against Moses and wondered if God would pay attention. The Promised Land seemed to be far away, and their hunger was here and now. They were told there was a purpose in their hunger: "To teach you that man does not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God".

It is against that background of Israel's testing in the desert that the story in today's gospel is told. Jesus is the new Israel; he has spent 40 days in the wilderness; Jesus was supposed to serve the Lord, God with his whole heart, with his whole soul and with his whole might. When he preaches Jesus sets great store by the undivided heart: "Do not set your hearts on things to eat and drink.... Set your heart first in the kingdom of God and these will be given as well."

Jesus is tempted to that he can serve without pain. He knows that loving God means exemption from harm. Finally, Jesus is tested about his attitude to power and wealth. Jesus' whole life says no to power and authority. The desert itself put him to the test. A desert gives you nothing to eat, it makes you utterly powerless, and it seems totally indifferent to your fate.

The three temptations of Jesus correspond to these facts about deserts. He felt hungry and He saw there only stones; secondly Jesus felt powerlessness and tempted to have power; thirdly the uncaring desert made Him to think God will send "His angels care for you". All these mean that the devil will try to enter the human world through human weakness.

A scholar says that Luke is thinking also of the Church when he describes this episode in the desert. The trials of Jesus are prolonged in His body the Church. It is the Church that is now in the desert, tempted by the devil. It is tempted to power; it is tempted to be only the material provider, and it is tempted to be only a show.


At an individual level we can all look around us and investigate our temptations. They will be related to our own time and place, to the things nearest us, to our hunger, ambitions and fears. The temptations of Jesus were not temptations to evil, but to limited kind of goodness – some kind of short term, self-defeating goodness.

We can say a lot about the theology of the temptation of Jesus. In our temptations whatever be it, only the grace of our Lord Jesus can help us. Paul, the great theologian, shares his experience from his own life with us. I prayed three times to the Lord that that thorn may go from his flesh. But the Lord said, "My grace is enough for you."

As we proceed through our Lenten journey let us pray to the Lord to help us always in our temptations with his grace.

#### **Father Jacob Joseph**

#### MARCH 19th IS FEAST DAY OF ST. JOSEPH



The Church encourages us to be devoted to Joseph because he was a model in the heroic practice of all the virtues. The example of virtuous living that he gave in the exact fulfillment of the duties of his state of life is worthy of our reflection. Read the gospel and you will see his faith, hope and charity practiced under trying circumstances. He was prudent in caring for his wife and the child; he showed great leadership in protecting them and assisting them. He was religious in every sense, with that delicacy and sincerity of conscience that is proper to the saints of God. He was just in his dealings with God and man. He was conspicuous for his fortitude and courage. He was truly

outstanding in the practice of virginal chastity. Moreover: he *protected* and *defended* Mary's virtue in the time of courtship and all during their life together. They had made a promise of chastity, and because they were resolved to live it for God they were blessed above all others. While Mary *inspired* him to practice this virtue perfectly, he, as a real man, understood the profound meaning of her inspiration and how it came from a heart that was steeped in the love of God. Time and again the Church has made it clear that Joseph is not a saint for only a certain number of souls, but that he can help *all* men.

Excepted from St. Joseph: a Theological Introduction by Michael D. Griffin, O.C.D.

This prayer is among the earliest prayers to St. Joseph, (from around 50 AD) and one of the best known:

Oh St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.




