BIBLE STUDY FOR 2025 If you would like to get a deeper understanding of scripture and the Church, we are offering two Bible Study groups beginning the week February 3rd.

Monday night class at 6:30 pm will study the Early Church history, which covers the first five hundred years of the Church's story, from the beginning of Church history at Pentecost, through the persecutions and councils of the first five centuries.

The <u>Wednesday class begins at 9:30 am, following 9:00 am Mass</u> and will study the Bible Timeline. The Bible Timeline® study program takes you on a guided journey through salvation history. Presenter Jeff Cavins will show you how fourteen of the Bible's narrative books tell the biblical story from beginning to end and will give you the keys to understanding the amazing story woven throughout Scripture. There is a workbook that is needed for this study that can be purchased through Ascension Press.

Everyone is welcome to join either or both groups. Ask your family or friends to join you in learning more about your faith.

The Baptism of the Lord Cycle C 2025

The baptism of the Lord marks the end of the liturgical season of Christmas. The baptism of Jesus is part of his epiphany. Before his baptism Jesus was largely unknown. Then he came one day to be baptized by John. The three readings stress the same theme, this is the beginning of a great mission. Jesus filled with the Holy Spirit begins his ministry.

John's baptism was the baptism of repentance. In figure and message John was different from Jesus. He came from the desert where he wore a garment made of camel hair and his food was locusts and wild honey. His message was rough; he began, you "Brood of vipers!" Could he be the Messiah, the promised one? Many thought he might be God could burn up most of them like chaff, John promised. This was a significant phrase because the pharisees regarded the common people as chaff - empty husks.

Jesus had no need of the baptism of repentance. Therefore, when people received John's baptism with repentance, St. Luke says Jesus was praying while he received the baptism. But when Jesus came for baptism he stood in line, shoulder to shoulder with sinners. And we see heaven is opened and message of the Father and the Holy Spirit came upon him. Here Jesus' public ministry begins with an act of compassion and solidarity as he takes upon himself all other burdens and sins. It is a symbol of what his work on earth was all about.

With the baptism Jesus begins his mission or ministry. His mission is described by Isaiah in the first reading. He will bring true justice to the nations – not by crying loud in the streets, but by opening the eyes of the blind and freeing captives and those who live in darkness. In the second reading, Peter tells us that after John's preaching of baptism, "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power."

We could see a difference in their messages. John's cousin too came from the desert, but their attitude was so different. Looking at the crowd "he felt sorry for them because they were like sheep without shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "the harvest is rich, but the laborers are few." He does not see them as chaff but as harvest – ripe and full of life. It is because he believes in us that we are able to believe in him.

Jesus showed solidarity with all of us who are in need of healing. He became like us so we could become like him. Jesus' baptism was the beginning of his public ministry as he identified himself with all human beings. Here he begins to gather his lambs as Isaiah describes the chosen servant of God in today's first reading. Jesus' baptism at the Jordan was not a private moment of revelation and blessing but a public commissioning to the work of redemption.

What is the effect of our baptism in us? Through our baptism we were made temples of the Holy Spirit, and we all know that! We were made children of God and heirs of heaven, and we all know that as well! What we can forget is that in baptism we were made part of the mission and the work of Christ. We tend to forget that.

The Holy Spirit we receive in baptism and other sacraments is not simply a private, spiritual event but a public responsibility. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit to us for the work of the Church. Pope Pius XII said many years ago, in baptism "We don't merely belong to the Church, we are the Church." Today, we remember the baptism of Jesus, his public embrace of his mission from his Father, and his solidarity with the human race. We also recall our own baptism when heavens were opened for us, the Holy Spirit descended upon us and we were commissioned to do God's work.

The deepest truth about our life is our baptismal call. What we have done with that grace, will be the source of our glory or our indictment in God's sight. The mission given us in baptism remains with us throughout our lifetime. We are never rebaptized because we were commissioned in the sacrament of baptism to represent Christ for the rest of our life.

A baby is God's message that life should go on


During the whole month of January, we will be collecting baby shower gifts for Crossroads Pregnancy Center. Please consider donating any of the following items.
