Epiphany Cycle C 2025

The feast of Epiphany began as the day when the Eastern part of the church celebrated the Incarnation. In the Chaldean church Epiphany means the birth of Christ. In some of the Eastern churches it is the Baptism of the Lord. In the western church it is the feast of "three kings"; the day when we recall the journey of the wise men from the East to Christ.

The heart of the Epiphany is the revelation of Christ to the Magi from the East, the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. St. Paul speaks to the Ephesians that "the Gentiles have become heirs, members of the same body and shares in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel". Jesus is savior not only for Jewish people, but also for everybody in very land and every culture. The message, power and love of Christ is for everyone. The Magi represents the whole gentiles, and the star is for the whole universe. Everybody and everything find fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

In explaining the event of Epiphany Pope Benedict gives few thoughts. When Magi had arrived at king's palace in Jerusalem they inquired after the newborn "King of Jews". In Jewish circle people would speak of it as the "king of Israel". In fact, the gentile title "King of Jews" does not reappear until Jesus' trial and the inscription over the cross. When Jesus was born the whole Jerusalem was troubled and on the Eve of his passion when Jesus entered into the Holy City, Matthew says whole city was quaking. That means the infancy narration echoes the passion of Christ.

At the time of Magi's visit and adoration they found the baby and his mother. Matthew did not mention the name of Joseph. Holy Father says the absence of Joseph is Matthew's way of presenting Jesus as the Son of God and Mary's virginity. When Magi left Bethlehem Joseph suddenly appears on the scene.

The star and the scripture took the Magi to Bethlehem and there they saw the little child with his mother. They fell down and worshipped him. They saw the manifestation of God in the form of a human child. The manifestation was not in human power but in human weakness, not in human richness but in poverty. In a baby's weakness, poverty, simplicity and in innocence the Magi found the fullness of God's glory. They opened their treasures and offered everything and fell down and worshipped him. They were wise enough to understand this baby is the Son of God, therefore we call them wise men from the East. This is the challenge that Epiphany presents before us.

There is a striking contrast in this gospel between these magi and people of Jerusalem. Jerusalem was a city proud of its power and religious heritage. It had the Temple and scriptures; it had teachers of the Law and priests of the solemn Temples sacrifices. And one day, these pagan magi somewhere in the East arrive seemingly out of nowhere, informing them, the Jewish people, the chosen people of a newborn King of Jews.

The leaders of Jerusalem were astonished, and some terrified. They knew the prophesies about the King, but they did not notice the star. But none of them took time to go with the magi to Bethlehem to see the king even though Bethlehem was only a few miles South of Jerusalem. As they entered the house something happened to the magi. They are transformed; their knowledge is transformed into wisdom. They understood this baby is the King of kings. They prostrated themselves and did him homage and offered him the gifts." They received a divine knowledge or wisdom to understand the baby is the Christ or the Messiah.

Can we see a similar contrast in our world too? We have people with great knowledge. People know many things, science history philosophy theology...the list is endless. Do they have wisdom? In Jesus, we are supposed to find the mystery of God. St. Paul says that in Him all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge are hidden. Our call is to realize "the breadth and length and height and depth" of this mystery "which surpasses all human knowledge.' Entrust these mysteries to humble and joyful contemplation of mind and heart, which is the stream and source of holiness and all the graces.

Let the celebration this feast help us to understand our Lord Jesus more and more and have the knowledge and wisdom from our God. Father Jacob Joseph


